This term Stage 5 students are learning about sustainable technologies to create a future town for outback Australia.

The Brief:

It's 2050 and Sydney can no longer sustain its population growth. A government mandate has been released, requesting submissions for a model and plan of sustainable towns to be established in regional Australia. To increase willingness to move to these towns, the government is providing incentives for different groups of skilled workers and newly migrated Australians to relocate to this town. As a town planner, your brief is to create and pitch a Design Proposal.

During Week 5, the students were lucky enough to have the opportunity to pitch their Design Proposals to our Parent Industry Experts. Our experts ran Masterclasses outlining their specific field and how this can be transferred to the student town designs. Students then had the opportunity to present and receive individual feedback on their proposals from our Experts.
